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**TWU IAM Joint Announcement
Manager Talking Points - May 16, 2013**

Reactive Media Statement

“Today’ s joint agreement between the IAM and the TWU again shows how working together to achieve common ground, which is not often seen in airline mergers, is yet another example of employees from both airlines supporting the US Airways/American merger.”

Manager Talking Points

The TWU and IAM’ s agreement will take effect when the merger is approved and the National Mediation Board (NMB) determines US Airways and American Airlines is a single carrier for purposes of representation. Once that determination is made, then an election will be held for each craft or class and if the association receives a majority of the votes cast in the election it will become the bargaining representative of the combined workgroup.

The unions have stated that three separate associations will be created - one for each workgroup that will be covered by the alliance: Mechanic & Related, Fleet Service, and Stores.

We expect the NMB to hold separate elections for each craft or class so employees in each workgroup will have the opportunity to vote for their bargaining representative.

If the associations are certified as the bargaining representatives for each workgroup, employees in these classifications will be members of either the TWU or the IAM, based on the location where they work and which union currently represents more members. The association agreements for each group include an Exhibit that identifies which locations will be TWU and which will be IAM.

The international union presidents will rotate serving as director of the association on a two year term basis.

The association will have separate negotiating committees for each workgroup and will all have an equal number of TWU and IAM representatives.

The current collective bargaining agreements for these workgroups remain in place. The association will begin working toward a joint collective bargaining agreement if the merger is closed and the membership elects the association to represent it.
